Yorktown Victory Center

The Yorktown Victory Center is undergoing a transformation with an imposing new facility and a reconfigured site plan allowing for vibrant multimedia gallery exhibits and enhanced outdoor interpretive programming.

A new name – American Revolution Museum at Yorktown® – will be implemented in Fall 2016 as the project nears completion.

The new 80,000-square-foot building opened in March 2015, and work continues on permanent gallery exhibits and a new introductory film.

American Revolution Museum at Yorktown: Outdoor Exhibits



Today visitors can enjoy showings of Revolution-theme films in the 170-seat theater and a glimpse of the future exhibits, as well as an expansive new gift shop and a cafe.

An indoor illustrated timeline spanning the second half of the 18th century leads to the outdoor re-created Continental Army encampment and Revolution-era farm, located in temporary quarters as construction proceeds on new, expanded settings for these living-history experiences.

The introductory film and exhibition galleries will debut with a preview of the new museum October 15 and 16, 2016, during the annual Yorktown Victory Celebration event marking the anniversary America's momentous 1781 Revolutionary War victory Yorktown.
